Dr. Joiner is the recipient of numerous grants and co-directs the Military Suicide Research Consortium, a \$30 million DoD project. Dr. Joiner has authored or edited 18 books. Largely as a result of his book, <u>Why People Die by Suicide</u> (2005, Harvard University Press), Dr. Joiner has appeared in many media outlets.
